

Gospel Reading Reflection

Today's reading from Matthew's Gospel comes after a discourse in which Jesus reproaches people who have witnessed his mighty deeds yet still lack belief. In this context, today's Gospel explains the reason for this unbelief and reveals what is necessary for faith. Today's Gospel also continues to enhance our understanding of discipleship as last week's Gospel did.

Jesus first prays in thanksgiving to God who has made himself known to Jesus' disciples. He praises God who has made himself known to the "little ones" and not to the wise and learned. As in other recent readings from Matthew's Gospel, a contrast is made here between the unbelieving Pharisees, who are wise and learned, and the faithful disciples, tax collectors, and sinners with whom Jesus keeps company.

The second part of this reading calls to our attention the unity between the Father and the Son. God has made himself known through Jesus, and in knowing Jesus, we come to know the Father. In Jesus' life and in his person, God reveals himself to us.

In the concluding sentences of today's Gospel, Jesus' teaching is again contrasted to the teaching of the Pharisees. This common theme of Matthew's Gospel probably reflects tension that existed between Jesus and the Pharisees and between the Pharisees and the community of Christians for whom Matthew wrote. Pharisaic Judaism became the predominant form of Judaism after the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem about 70 A.D. Here that tension is expressed as alternative paths of holiness. The careful observance of the Mosaic law taught by the Pharisees could be experienced by some as difficult and burdensome. In contrast, Jesus' way of holiness is presented as uncomplicated and even restful.

Mission Appeal

As part of the annual Mission Cooperation Plan, St Landry Church this weekend has the opportunity to support the mission of the Diocese of Soroti, Uganda. Fr. Geoffrey Akiso Odongo from Uganda is here this Sunday to celebrate all the Masses and to make the appeal. Below is a brief profile of the projects for which the Diocese of Soroti is seeking support.

The Catholic faith continues to spread in leaps and bounds in the Diocese of Soroti. For example, in 2019 alone, there were 31,309 Infant Baptisms. Every single Church parish in the entire Diocese is filled beyond capacity at its principal Sunday liturgies with a significant number of people standing outside the Church. After over 5 years without a Bishop, Pope Francis in March 2019 appointed Bishop Joseph Eciru Oliach to lead and shepherd the people of God in the Diocese. After his episcopal ordination in May 2019, he had 22,600 Confirmations between June and December of 2019 alone!

To meet the overwhelming need for pastoral services, the new bishop created 15 new parishes in the summer of 2019 and additional II since then. These were created by breaking up the largest of the existing 26 parishes. In essence, the number of parishes have doubled! These new parishes are in dire need for buildings and other facilities (churches, rectories, halls and other health/ social/ educational amenities). The proceeds from this mission appeal will therefore be applied towards facilitating the development of these new parishes. The funds will especially be dedicated to the procurement of manufactured and/or imported building products (cement, iron bars, roofing metals, iron sheets and paint) to enable the construction of buildings in the new parishes. In addition, most of these parishes are located in rural areas with no grid electricity and water systems. The proceeds will also be applied to securing solar electricity systems and water units: water wells/water boreholes/rain water harvesters

Every donation counts and nothing is too small. Here is a sample of what your donation could help purchase:

- -\$ 10 can purchase one bag of cement
- -\$ 25 can purchase one piece of roofing timber
- -\$50 can purchase one bundle of 6 iron rods
- \$100 can purchase one bag of roofing nails
- \$ 100 can purchase one Roofing Iron Sheet - \$ 1,000 can purchase 800 Gallon Water Tank for rain-water harvest
- \$ 5,000 can purchase a solar unit to light up the Rectory
- \$ 10,000 can fund the construction of a water-well or borehole for perennial water supply.
